(PEYA) recognizes outstanding environmental stewardship projects developed by K-12 youth. The PEYA program honors a wide variety of projects developed by young students, school classes and clubs, youth camps, and youth groups. Each year, each of the 10 EPA regional offices selects up to one winner in each age group: Grades K-5 and Grades 6-12. Award winners receive a Presidential plaque. Deadline: **January 11, 2023**.

[The 2022 Changemaker Video Challenge](#)- Do you know any teens who are frustrated with the world and want to do something about it?! Encourage them to submit a video on one of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) highlighting their views and how they want to see things change! Teens simply create a short two-minute video showcasing their idea! 10 winners will be selected to receive up to \$500 to implement their vision. Deadline: **January 23**.

[EPA's 2022 Business Video Challenge](#). EPA will award a total of \$50,000 in prize money through this video challenge. High school and college students are invited to create stories illustrating how businesses in the U.S. are reducing toxic chemical releases through innovative pollution prevention practices, and by having a positive impact on the environment and communities. Participants have a chance to win up to \$5,000. Deadline: **February 17**.

[EPA's 2022 Student Video Contest](#) challenges students to create a short video connecting world population growth to one of three global topics: Climate Change, Waste, and Gender Equality. 1. **Infrastructure bill implementation:** Contact your elected officials and encourage them to spend funding on needed infrastructure with climate-friendly solutions.
2. **State energy efficiency -** [state energy efficiency scorecard](#). NY is # 5. Contact your state legislators and governor to let them know you support their efforts to make our state more energy efficient for a healthier environment and economy.
3. **On a Campus?** Universities and colleges must be ambitious when it comes to tackling the climate crisis. One of the most important steps is to commit to the Global Climate Letter find out more [here](#).

The voters approved The Environmental Bond Act, for \$4.2 billion into environmental projects. Proposed bills to allocate some funding (bills with numbers already have a sponsor) are below:

Climate and Community Protection Fund creates a pool of money to fund and implement our landmark Climate Act. Its core investments include community benefits and broad labor, procurement, and responsible contracting standards.

Climate Accountability Act gives state agencies the power and guidance they need to effectively implement the Climate Act, ensuring that the energy system is accountable and transparent to the public while paving the way to full decarbonization.

Gas Transition and Affordable Energy Act (S.8198 / A.9329 of 2022) will give the Public Service Commission (PSC) the authority and direction to align gas utility regulations and system planning with the

Blueprint Bill (S.8405B / A.9881B of 2022) provides a plan to guide the replacement and redevelopment out a direction for moving forward with the transition off fossil fuels per the Climate Act.

The Fossil Fuel Subsidy Elimination Act (S.7438 / A.8483 of 2022) will end state subsidies of \$330 million to climate crisis contributors the fossil fuel industry.
