Southbank Center is displaying its latest holiday decoration: a Christmas tree powered entirely by Brussels sprouts! T due to a vegetable-powered battery, which was created by scientists from The Big Bang UK Young Scientists and Engineers Fair. Over 1,000 of the sprouts provide .
